What to film

We'd like you to either film a selfie or get someone to film you responding to the following questions.

It can be a parent, older sibling or grandparent responding to these questions.

Additionally, if you can film:

What your current 'learn from home' set up looks like

Share any footage that you may have already filmed which is funny, fun, challenging or demonstrates what the experience has been like.

Questions for parents

What is your child's teacher's name?

How has this experience changed your view of what teachers do?

What have been the challenges with trying to teach your kids from home?

What are some of the things you've learned about your own children during this time?

What are some of the different tools teachers have provided to help facilitate learning from home?

What would you want to say to all the teachers working through this pandemic?

What's the funniest thing that has happened while having your kids learning at home?

What are you looking most forward to when going back to school?


How have your parent/s been helping you learn?

Filming instructions.


Some filming guidelines.

Here are some helpful guidelines to ensure we can capture the best quality footage.



Film in horizontal mode

Whether you're filming a selfie or someone else, make sure your phone is in a horizontal (landscape) orientiation.



Keep it steady

Try keep the footage steady, if possible, use both hands to hold your smartphone as close as possible to your body as you record the video.



Avoid background noise

Be concious of any background noise that can affect the audio recording.



Give it some buffer

When possible, record a bit before the action and stop recording of a couple seconds after. This gives us more flexibility in editing.



Video settings

If you can, make sure your video settings are at 4k and 25 fps. Most phones have this as their default.



Lighting

Best to film during the middle of the day, so that the camera on your phone can automatically adjust based on the lighting available.

Time to share your message.

Thank you for capturing your footage. To make it a simple as possible, follow these steps to share what you have filmed.
